- The Western Australia State Government announced that Phase 4 of the WA roadmap will be extended for a two-month period meaning the new tentative start date of Phase 5 will now be Saturday, October 24. Therefore, under these regulations, Netball WA will continue to plan the Championships to be run under Phase 4 protocols.

- Netball WA is currently looking at the capacity for spectators attending the 2020 event ensuring that this fits Phase 4 protocols.
- There will be parking, entry and exit protocols in place over the weekend
- Please be aware Association spectators and teams are not permitted to bring their own chairs or team benches to this event.
- There will be no athlete's village over the weekend, so no Marquees are available.
