

## SATURDAY COMP ROLLING SUBS POLICY

## KDNA ROLLING SUBS – SATURDAY COMPETITON

Rolling Subs allows players to interchange in quick succession throughout the game, an unlimited number of times.

• Both Teams and scoring/timing officials to be sat on the same side of court. Each team may place a cone/dot to signify their rolling area, if they wish to do so.



- Players rolling on/off must meet at their designated rolling area, switch bibs and tag hands
- New player enters the court staying ON SIDE
- Teams must have a minimum of 5 players on court at all times during play
- Teams must not delay play, for example roll off a CENTRE position as they are about to take their centre pass KDNA advises everyone, that although the rules listed below are the rules stated by Netball WA., KDNA has chosen to use its discretion this season in applying penalties when rolling substitutions are incorrectly utilised, as we recognise the inclusion of this new ruling will be a learning curve for everyone. In the first instance, umpires will take the opportunity to educate players and coaches on the correct use of rolling substitutions rather than immediately penalising teams. Likewise, umpires are also familiarising themselves with this new rule, so please be patient whilst they are also learning.

## PENALTIES APPLIED FOR INCORRECT USE OF ROLLING SUBS

- Delaying Play: Umpire blows whistle for Centre pass, then again for centre delay, penalty is advanced 5 metres and centre stands out of play
- Bibs not exchanged OFF the court: If a player takes their bib off before leaving the court that position will remain vacant until the next stoppage in play. If a player enters the court before placing their bib, they will be asked to leave the court until the next stoppage in play.
- Offside rule: If the player rolling on/off goes into an offside area, the opposing team will be rewarded a free pass where the player went offside. Advantage rule will be applied where the free pass would disadvantage the opposing team.
